A very rare example of an early Chinese token issued in Mexico in US Dollars. Northern Mexico had a sizable Chinese immigrant population at the turn of the 20th century, as Chinese men (with very few women) arrived as agricultural laborers and gradually developed into small business owners. Mexicali, in particular, had the largest Chinese community in all of Mexico and still retains a large Chinese presence in the city's Chinatown, La Chinesca.

The Guna (Kuna) people of Panama's San Blas Islands traditionally wear a small gold ring in their septum as part of their distinctive female attire, which also includes colorful Mola blouses, red headscarves, and beaded arm and leg bands. These gold nose rings are precious to the Guna and are worn to emphasize their beauty and cultural identity. Gold artifacts from the region often used a technique called 'tumbaga,' an alloy of gold and copper (and sometimes silver) that was surface-enriched to look like pure gold. It is likely the gold used in traditional Kuna ornaments was also an alloy of varying purity.

These miniature cannons were made of various metals including bronze, brass, copper, and iron, and were actually fired on important occasions such as weddings and the birth of children. Valued by weight at \$25-30 a picul, they were used extensively for a multitude of purposes, such as the barter of goods, bride price, payment of fines and the purchase of slaves (a slave being valued in piculs of brass guns). With the introduction of coins, these cannons gradually fell out of use. Many were also melted down during World War II, which accounts for their rarity today.

The 6 stuiver issues were struck from Japanese copper bars as emergency coins to compensate for the silver larins which were being hoarded by the local people and caused a temporary silver shortage. The rate of the silver larin at that time was 12 stuivers, thus the bronze 6 stuivers had a value of 1/2 of a silver larin. The copper bars were struck on each end with the value VI / St within a leafy wreath. Neither length (which varies from approximately 98 to 127 mm) nor the weight is constant across all issues.

The "Bai Jin San Pin" (White metal three kinds), according to the Records of the Grand Historian, was introduced in 119 BC during the reign of Emperor Wu as both the Han-Xiongnu War and the territorial expansion of the Han Empire caused the imperial government to desperately increase their revenues. Among the reasons why the government started issuing this new type of currency was to remedy the inflation caused by the excessive issuance of bad money, but the Bai Jin San Pin would prove to be an insufficient solution. The Records of the Grand Historian claim

that the new "Bai Jin" (white metal) money was a mixture of silver and tin. The term San Pin refers to the fact that it was a series of three coins with different denominations: Dragon 3000 cash coins, Horse 500 cash coins and Tortoise 300 cash coins.



At that time 5000 Wu Zhu was equal to 1/2 cattie of gold. A cattie weighed about 120 grams, so these knives were valued at about 60 grams (2 ounces) of pure gold. We have not been able to find a relative value for gold in ancient China, but in the same time frame in the Roman Empire, two ounces of gold would have been at least a year's wages to an average citizen, thus the problem with this issue. It was fiat currency with a named value very high, but with little intrinsic value.

Beiting Big Iron Money also known as "Xiliao Big Iron Money", is named because it is mainly unearthed near the site of the former city of Beiting in Jimusar County, Xinjiang, China. The script on this coin is possibly Tocharian. During the 6th to 9th centuries this script (derived from the Indo-European Brahmi alphabet) was in use at sites as Kucha, Turfan, and Karashar (Xinjiang). It is also possible that the script is Kidan (Qidan). More research on this rare type is needed which is tentatively assigned to the Western Liao. The ancient city of Beiting was the headquarters of the Beiting Protectorate during the 8th century. It was later known as Beshbaliq (Beshbaliq) and became one of the capitals of the Uyghur Khaganate and then the Kingdom of Qocho (Kara-Khoja), the later which became a Western Liao vassal state in 1128 during the reign of Bilge Tekin.

Balasagun was the capital of the Qara Khitay state in 12th-13th Centuries. The Western Liao (1124-1218) dynasty, also known as Qara Khitay state, was founded by Yelü Dashi, a member of the Liao royal family, who led the remnants of the Liao Dynasty to Central Asia after fleeing from the Jurchen conquest of their homeland in the North and Northeast of modern-day China. It was usurped by the Naimans under Küchülük in 1211 and finally destroyed by the Mongol Empire in 1218.

Da Chao, meaning "Great Dynasty", was the Chinese name the Mongols used for themselves. According to Hartill, "This [silver] coin is alleged to have been cast by the legendary Genghis Khan at his capital at Karakorum." This would place the date about 50-60 years prior to the formal foundation of the Yuan dynasty in 1271. A more likely attribution by Belyaev & Sidorovich (2017) puts this series between 1251 and 1262 during the reign of Möngke Khan and the early years of Kublai Khan.

Palace cash may or may not be considered a type of amulet. These were made as New Year's gifts to people in the Imperial Palace, usually eunuchs and guards, who often hung the smaller ones below lamps and the larger ones below curtains. Hartill, in "Qing Cash" (Royal Numismatic Society, 2003), agrees they were handed

out as gifts in the Palace, but only upon the establishment of each new reign title, and were wrapped in red cloth.

In October 1886, the Bao Jin mint Tianjin was opened casting 1 qian weight coins. In 1888, Governor-general Li Hongzhang reported at length on the problems of striking cash using western machinery. (This had been bought from Greenwood and Batley of Leeds for 27,000 liang of silver.) Despite careful costing, it cost 2,237 cash to make 1,000 regulation coins. Permission was earnestly requested to discontinue use of the machinery. In 1896, the mint was reopen-ed with 12 furnaces producing 7 or 8 fen weight coins. It was closed in 1900.

Cao Kun (1862-1938), or Tsao Kun, was a Chinese warlord and politician. He later became the leader of the Zhili Clique of the Beiyang Army and infamously won the presidential office in 1923 by openly bribing each assembly member with 5000 silver dollars.

There is no doubt that Muhammad Malla was killed in AH1278 (February 1862). Although it was formerly considered a rebel issue in or near Khoqand, Irpon Tukhtiev & Vladimir Nastich have proven that these coins were actually struck at Kashgar in Sinkiang by local rebels under the authority of Ya'qub Beg (their paper delivered at the 9th All-Russian Numismatic Conference in Veliki Novgorod in 2001). They bore no relationship to actual issues of Khoqand, and were replaced in AH1290 by issues in the name of the Ottoman sultan 'Abd al-'Aziz, correctly citing the mint of issue as Kashghar. It is possible that the dies were produced at Khoqand and shipped to Kashgar for Ya'qub Beg.

This is the first example of the Artist's Medal of the Second East Turkistan Republic (ETR) to appear in the West and only one of two in existence that we are aware of. According to the consignor, this medal was acquired in the Ili area from the descendants of the late original recipient, who refused to sell it during his lifetime due to its significance and rarity, as evidenced by the very low issue number. The owner of the other medal (with the issue number 6) relates a similar story, as he acquired his example from a retired army musician who played the flute in the East Turkistan National Army before immigrating to Uzbekistan in the 1960's. According to the musician, his medal was one among eleven personally presented by Ehmetjan Qasimi (1914-1949), the Minister of Foreign Affairs, in Ghulja in 1947. The number 4 on the medal suggests

this award was created in 1944, the same year when the ETR was proclaimed. However, it is unclear if any similar medals were produced in these previous years. The First East Turkistan Republic, officially the Islamic Republic of East Turkistan, was a short-lived breakaway would-be Islamic republic founded on November 12, 1933. It was centered on the city of Kashgar in what is today the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region in China. With the sacking of Kashgar in 1934 by Hui warlords nominally allied with the Kuomintang government in Nanjing, the First East Turkistan Republic was effectively eliminated.
