491	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – TAHIRID: Tahir I, 821-822, AR dirham (3.15g), Surâdiq Abarshahr, AH206, A-1391, citing the Tahirid governor Muhammad b. Humayd al-Tahiri in the obverse margin, also citing the Abbasid caliph al-Ma'mun and Tahir himself as Dhu'l-Yaminayn ("possessor of two right hands", i.e., ambidextrous, here meaning that he held both military and civil positions) in the reverse field; a few marginal adhesions, mostly on the reverse, XF, RRR. 1279	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – JAPAN: AR medal (71.22g), ND, reproduction of the first place winner's medal for the first modern Olympic Games held in Athens in 1896 designed by the renowned French artist and medalist Jules-Clement Chaplain; laureate head of Zeus is depicted, holding a sphere, on which the winged goddess of victory Nike stands, holding an olive branch with "Olympia" in Greek to left // the Acropolis rock with the Parthenon depicted with Greek inscription "International Olympic Games" above and "In Athens / 1896" in exergue, Japan Mint hallmarks at lower right with the flag of Japan, 1000 within diamond, and jungin "pure silver", matte finish, About Unc.

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	The Mint of Japan accepts assay requests from domestic producers of precious metal wares and applies an official hallmark indicating the fineness. The "1000" stamp was used before April 2012 and has since been changed to "999".

1415	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – YUAN: Yan You, 1314-1320, AE temple coin (1.1g), H-19.52, graded 78 by GBCA Grading Company, F-VF
1419	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – YUAN: Zhi Yuan, 1285-1294, AE cash (4g), H-19.17, graded 82 by GBCA Grading Company, VF to XF, ex Dr. Dirk Löer Collection, ex Teutoburger Münzauktion 91, Lot 68. Kublai Khan (Zhi Yuan) was the fifth Khagan (Great Khan) of the Ikh Mongol Uls (Mongol Empire), reigning from 1260 to 1294, and the founder of the Chinese Yuan dynasty, a division of the Mongol Empire.

1533	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – BACTRIA: Diodotos II Theos, ca. 235-225 BC, AR drachm (4.04g), Bop-7Cvar, diademed head right // Zeus Bremetes advancing left, brandishing aegis and thunderbolt, eagle standing left by his front foot, wreath to inner left, monogram to inner right, rare unpublished monogram, cleaned, smoothing scratches on reverse, F-VF
1819	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – ABBASID: al-Muqtadir, 908-932, AR dirham (2.29g), A-246.2-var, contemporary imitation, with the name al-muqtadir and the rest of the legends on both sides retrograde, with the marginal legends utterly meaningless, probably struck at some time circa 930-960; pierced twice and slightly uneven surfaces, VF, RR NOTE: In the printed auction catalog we referenced this as a likely Georgian issue. The association with Georgia is very uncertain and should at best be ignored.
1843	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION – Yahya b. ‘Ali was the governor at al-Basra in Morocco for Hisham, which confirms the importance of this piece, thanks to further research by the consignor
2157	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – GREAT MONGOLS: Töregene, 1241-1246, AR dirham (2.23g) (Imil), AH6(4)3, A-3752C, tengri kuchundur (Mongolian for "by the power of the eternal God") in the Arabic script and the tamgha of Ögedei in the center, bold date around // Arabic al-imam al-a'zam, VF. Struck under Töregene Khatun during the interregnum between the death of Ögedei and the election of Güyük.
2160	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – GREAT MONGOLS: temp. Ögedei, 1227-1241, AR dirham (2.35g), Pulad, DM, A-3746P, Zeno-128623, Allah in the obverse center, part of date formula around // Arabic al-imam al-a'zam, mint above, known for most dates AH631-636, decent VF

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2339	UPDATED DESCRIPTION – VENAD: Garuda Series, AE kasu (2.53g), ca. later 15th century, Sarasan-109, figure seated facing with arms outstretched // winged Garuda running right, VF Sarasan attributes this series to the second half of the 15th century when Venad was free from the direct control of the Vijayanagar Empire.
2411	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION – small testcut on either side
2569	INTERESTING NOTE – the East India Company balemark is retrograde!
3141	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION – later unofficial white-metal imitation of bronze medal
3243	CORRECTION – the denomination is 1/80 riyal
